Summary of Disaster Relief Australia

Disaster Relief Australia www.disasterreliefaus.org comprises a mix of military veterans and individuals trained in emergency services that volunteer in **recovery** (not response) after an event such as a fire or flood. They have 660 volunteers registered in WA and 5600 across Australia.

Type of Work. DRA can:

- Assist residents who are under/not insured they often work with older people or people with disabilities.
- Work with businesses to get them back on their feet after an event.
- Clear/repair burnt fences.
- Work in mitigation (including firebreaks) if requested.

They can assist recovery after an incident impacting just a small number of properties.

How they Deploy. DRA:

- Take approximately 3 weeks to activate.
- Set up a Forward Operating Base and stay for 3-4 days, sleeping on camp beds. A Recreation Centre would be a typical venue.
- Send out crews of four including one usually a chainsaw operator.

Get Involved. DRA are happy for locals to register with them and provide insurance for Spontaneous Volunteers (SVs) who can register on the day via an App, QR code or hard copy. Volunteers wanting to use chainsaws must be accredited (see training below). Many volunteers sign up in response to just one event in their local area – there is no obligation to volunteer in response to other disasters.

Training. DRA runs training on 4WD, remote first aid, chainsaw, fencing repairs/ removal. They even free courses to provide Nationally Accredited chainsaw certificate.

Balingup Future Involvement

Step 1 is for the Shire to sign a Memorandum of Understanding with DRA. Susie Delaporte (Shire Local Recovery Officer) has this in hand. Balingup then has the opportunity to:

- Invite DRA to make a presentation (if needed)
- Advertise /encourage locals to join DRA and attend training (free chainsaw and 4WD courses could be very useful for younger members of the community).
- Potentially participate in a joint community/DRA recovery exercise to test both the DRA and CISCO processes.
