NEW BUSINESS Shire Lease Agreement	The Shire has released its draft framework for lease agreements. It is based on Shire-owned buildings, with the Shire providing building insurance – it has many restrictions on what can/cannot be done (modifications/signage etc). BPA will need to negotiate a special lease and W.Trow has provided this feedback via the Shire website. https://www.donnybrook-balingup.wa.gov.au/pmf-framework-policies.aspx	W.Trow
Mining Tenements.	Jeff Bremer Chairman - Save Preston River Valley contacted W.Trow re a mining tenement proposed to the East of Balingup on 30 June. Opportunity for objections closed on Monday 3 rd July. Objections require effort - if an objection is raised, the person must attend court to present their case. Companies applying for tenements are often newly registered (the recent application is from Griffin Footwear HK, registered in 2020 with no website/not registered for GST). This is similar to an application raised in 2022 – at that point BPA wrote to the Department of Mines, Industry, Regulation & Safety and the Shire CEO advising "if DMIRS or the Shire receives an application from any company to commence ground work in any tenements, BPA to be informed immediately". It was agreed that BPA writes to the Minister for Mines to query the process.	W.Trow
Rail Project	In recognition of the contribution to be made to overall business case for the reopening of the Bunbury-Greenbushes rail line, the Talison Board has committed \$25,000 to conduct a feasibility study with the Balingup Rail Group (BRG) into a high-yield, zero emissions tourism and commuter service on the Bunbury-Bridgetown line. As part of Talison's commitment, it has nominated senior Talison managers to sit on the BRG and to participate in the selection of suitably qualified consultants to deliver the business case for such a tourist/commuter service. Talison's contribution adds to the \$25,000 pledged by 5 SW local governments. Discussions are underway with Alstom, an advanced international train manufacturer specialising hydrogen and battery operated trains to set up a showcase zero emissions system for Australia and the Asia Pacific on the Bunbury-Bridgetown line. Post Script The WA Government announced on 14 July 2023 a commissioning of a Government-Industry study into recommissioning the Bunbury-Greenbushes line to manage the rapidly growing freight task associated with the Talison Greenbushes expansion. BACH/Town Hall Development	2023-2024 budget round a proposal for a three-year \$24 000 Service Level Agreement (\$8 000 per annum) with the Balingup Arts and Culture Hub (BACH).
