If all agree there is merit in the idea, a meeting will be held with the wider community to seek input. The community foundation model has a very structured financial management process in place. FRUIT FLY BAIT IS NOW AVAILABLE AT BALINGUP TRANSFER STATION - FREE

Fruit flies burrow into plums, apricots, peaches, apple, citrus and many other types of fruit tree.



You can't see it from the outside, but when you open the fruit up, you will see a nasty black rot......with wiggly worms



This is what the (new) Queensland fruit fly looks like. Report all sightings.

The good news is that you can prevent this!

Just pop into Balingup Transfer Station with a small container (500ml is usually enough) and they will give you some of the bait for free. Then, just use a small paintbrush to flick it (once or twice a week) onto the trees until your fruit has finished.

You can also make your own fruit fly bait. Just google the recipe or go to https://www.agric.wa.gov.au/sites/gateway/files/Make%20a%20fruit%20fly%20trap.pdf
