	Balingup Music Experience – Gary Hodge provided an overview of a new concept (full details at Annex A)

	contribute to the town, apply and receive grants, pay for services when needed and acquire assets) 2. Endorse the establishment of a bank account with the Bendigo Bank Donnybrook with three signatories. W.Trow to advise AON Insurance of the event.
	Road Safety. Michael Staffa raised concern regarding the speed of traffic through the town. It was agreed that he would develop a plan of action and bring it to a BPA meeting for approval. He will incorporate the need for extra 40kph signs. Action M.Staffa
	Event Coordinator. Due to new Covid regulations, SFFD has been cancelled. The Event Coordinator has generously agreed that her contract be terminated by mutual agreement, with effect 31 Jan 22. Treasurer will: • pay final invoices received from Ms Rul, • return any balance remaining in the Event Coordinator account to the SFFD, and • Close the Event Coordinator account. Action P.Ridley.
	FRRR Grant W.Trow advised BPA/SFFD submitted an application for funding to Foundation for Rural and Regional Renewal. With the cancellation of the 2022 SFFD, she contacted FRRR. FRRR recommended that, instead of withdrawing the application, we leave it in the pool for consideration. If it is successful, we can negotiate with them and there may be a possibility to have it extended to 2023. Action W.Trow.

Agricultural Show grants

It may be possible to get grant to cover SFFD losses in 2021 but books would need an audit (possible cost \$1000 or more). It was agreed that, if eligible, the BPA Executive should make the decision as to whether to progress or not. Closing date for applications is 17 Feb 22. Action W.Trow.

Bendigo Grant

Bendigo Bank has issued a new grant opportunity – 'Building Accessible & Inclusive Communities' which could include disability awareness training, infrastructure modifications or the purchase of assistive technologies such as hearing loops or other ideas to increase inclusion. Opens 1 Feb. Closes 29 April. Up to \$10,000 but community group must contribute one third. It was agreed that this grant be referred to BADSA. Action W.Trow.

Covid regulations

W.Trow advised that she has reactivated the Covid phone tree — designed to help people who are voluntarily staying at home and those who may be sick. She also distributed a draft mailout which would be issued when Covid becomes more prevalent in the area. It was agreed that this be promoted as a BPA activity. Mailout to include a statement that the "information below is accurate at time of printing and may change". Action — W.Trow

Future BPA meetings

Due to the difficulty of holding meetings with masks/ indoors, it was agreed that the March and April BPA meetings be held on a Tuesday morning so they can be held outside. Action – J.Hornum

Cluster Developments

W.Trow recapped the concept of Cluster Developments. This idea was first raised in 1995 during a Balingup community planning session and again raised in 2021. W.Trow has initiated a survey in the community to ascertain the level of support . 19^{th} - 22 January. The results are as follows:

- · 26 emails 23 support cluster concept, 3 unsure.
- · 29 positive responses on Facebook, 3 unsure/comments.
- 39 support (handwritten survey)

The meeting agreed that the President should arrange to meet with the Shire Senior Planner, Kira Strang to present the results of the survey with a request that it be included in the review of the Local Planning Strategy 7. Action by W.Trow

Water Corporation Update

W.Trow provided a summary of an email received 8 December 22 from Water Corp (she has put a notice put on FB, emailed to Preston Press)

- The new PVC pipeline will come from North Greenbushes and use water from Millstream Dam.
- The 150mm pipeline runs through Balingup to Mullalyup
- · It will provide a backup supply to Balingup in the event the

- existing reinforced concrete pipeline breaks from Balingup Dam. A pressure reducing valve (PRV) has been installed to allow this changeover.
- The PRV is that it may be opened to supplement Balingup during periods of high demand when the pressure drops in town.
- The effectiveness of this backup supply will not be known until commissioning has been completed.
- The Water Corporation will never guarantee water supply during bushfires which is why we state all customers must not rely on scheme water to fight fires. The purpose of our water supply scheme to Balingup is for household/business use.

Cleaning Community Centre

H.Christensen requested that another \$380 be paid into her cleaning account and this was approved at the meeting. Helen to submit an invoice (including account details).

Balingup Historical Group

A new display is being prepared over the next 2 weeks for display. An Indigenous display is being prepared by Sandra Hill and Judy Allen.

DRAFT The Balingup Music Experience (Working Title)

The Balingup Music Experience comprises a group of local residents committed to bringing a wide range of musical experiences to the town including professional performances, community music workshops, master classes, music therapy and wellbeing programs as well as compositional, musical theatre and educational programs.

The music genres include, but not limited to, chamber, classical, choral, jazz, blues, folk and country.

It is proposed that the majority of musical experiences provided to the community take place in the Balingup Town Hall, and in particular in the Lesser Hall.

Background

An example of local support for varied music programs has been established through the Brookvale House concerts since 2013. Over that period, some 50 not-for-profit concerts have been provided, covering a wide range of genres. Attached is a summary of around 30 of the 50 concerts held. With 50 concerts fully subscribed, over 3 000 people have attended these concerts raising over \$130 000 in door sales, the proceeds of which have gone to paying musicians. To date all administration costs have been voluntary.

The Balingup Music Experience Proposal

To build on the above history, audience development and legacy, it is proposed that a group (The Balingup Music Experience) be established under the umbrella of the Balingup Progress Association. This group aims to contribute directly to BPA's current strategic plan focusing on Balingup as a resilient, thriving community with a vibrant, village feel and a community that creates, learns and grows together.

Balingup Music Experience Governance

The group needs to be able to receive public monies, acquire assets, pay for services when needed and be accountable to the Balingup community.

To that end, there is a need to establish a committee and open a bank account under the auspices of the BPA.

Recommendations

That the BPA:

- 1. Endorse the establishment of the Balingup Music Experience under the umbrella benefits provided by the Progress Association (capacity to contribute to the town, apply and receive grants, pay for services when needed and acquire assets)
- 2. Endorse the establishment of a bank account with the Bendigo Bank Donnybrook with three signatories
