	 Railway Line. Malcolm Lee, Chair of the Balingup Rail Group (BRG) provided an overview of the group's progress: The estimated cost to upgrade the railway line would be around \$50 million (excluding road infrastructure eg overpasses). It is possible that eventually the service would be autonomous (electric trains with minimum of 5G telecommunications along the route). Talison is increasing production of lithium to meet world demand and are conducting their own feasibility study into transport ore via rail. A Talison staff member also attends BRG meetings. BRG is actively seeking funds for a feasibility study into a tourist rail. Two Shires (Donnybrook- Balingup and Bridgetown-Greenbushes) have already reserved \$5000 each for contribution to that cost if other local governments and South West Development Commission agree to contribute. Overall there is reason to hope that this project will go ahead but it will be a slow process. 	Information

Balingup – Water Supply & Mobile Phones Update (Article in July edition of Preston Press)

Did you know that:

- Water Corporation will never guarantee water supply during bushfires and state that customers must NOT rely
 on scheme water to fight fires. "If you choose to stay and defend you must have access to your own supply.
 More often than not schemes rely on pump stations to move water from one place to another and this
 infrastructure, like most things during a bush fire, is at risk of being damaged. The purpose of Water Corporation
 water supply scheme to Balingup is for household/business use".
- Telstra says that the mobile network should not be relied upon in an emergency. 'Our sites typically have battery or generators in case of a disruption to energy supplies. This back-up power is designed to provide some protection during local community power loss, but will not support the loss of power for extended periods'.

Balingup Progress Association has been working closely with Telstra, Water Corporation and the Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup to improve the ability of the community to respond during an emergency. Here is an update on progress.

Water Supply

- A new 150mm PVC pipeline from North Greenbushes (running through Balingup/Mullalyup) uses water from Millstream Dam. The pipeline will provide a backup supply to Balingup in the event that the existing reinforced concrete pipeline, from Balingup Dam, breaks. This has happened previously and resulted in the town going without water over a weekend.
- A pressure reducing valve (PRV) has been installed to allow changeover from the concrete pipeline to the new 150mm PVC pipeline.
- One of the benefits of the PRV is that it may also be opened to supplement Balingup during periods of high demand when the pressure drops in town.
- The effectiveness of this backup supply will not be known until commissioning has been completed however the emergency pressure reducing valve has been installed and has been tested and works.
- Water Corporation plans to replace part of the water mains on Jayes Rd and along South West Highway but do
 not have confirmation of the date as yet. They will include Balingup Progress Association as a stakeholder when
 these works are planned in.

Mobile Phones

- The current battery reserves in Balingup are approximately 4 hours at the mobile tower site and 6 hours to the exchange (landlines).
- The Shire has purchased a satellite phone for use when the phone tower goes down. This is stored at the Fire Shed but we are developing a procedure to ensure the community can access the phone during emergencies.
- NBN has installed a STAND 'pop up' internet node at the Recreation Centre this will allow up to 30 mobile phones to make calls even when the main tower is down (users must be in close proximity to the STAND unit). BPA is working with the Shire to obtain a backup generator to provide power for the STAND unit).

Getting this far has been a slow and tedious process, but we hope that Balingup will be in a much better position to respond to emergencies in the future.
